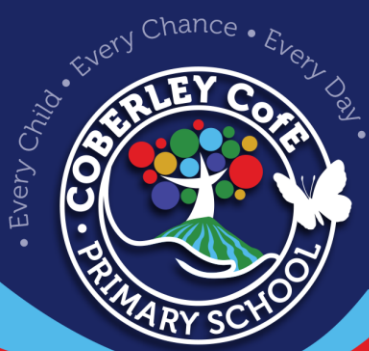

Car Break-in

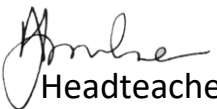
