Each year we are obliged to undertake statutory assessment and each year we achieve remarkable things. This year 82% of children passed the EYFS profile in reception (National average is approximately 72%), 100% passed the phonics test in Year 1 (National average is approximately 83%), 80% passed Key Stage 1 in reading, writing and maths (National average is approximately 70%) and 80% passed Key Stage 2 in reading, writing and maths (National average is approximately 64%). 50% achieved greater depth in all three (only 10% achieve this nationally).

In the Key Stage 2 assessments we achieved 80% greater depth in reading and 70% greater depth in maths. 22 test papers out of 30 were marked at greater depth and 8 at 100%! Now we know why our expensive but educationally sound teaching model works so well.

Gordon Rae's Assembly

On Tuesday, Mr Rae brought a special visitor with him who was a refugee from Iran. The worship and story were about this term's Christian value – Justice. The children were very interested and enjoyed learning about different cultures.





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Class 2's play, 'The Bee Musical'

On Tuesday 9th July, Class 2 performed a play called the Bee Musical. The play was all about why bees are so important to humans. In the play the bees get hungry so they put on a play to show the townspeople how important they are.

They are so important because they pollinate a third of the crops grown for humans to eat. Before the play, most people felt nervous or excited but they didn't need to worry because it went really well. Class 2 were only given three weeks to practice and everybody learnt their lines. Some people had to learn extra lines because people were off sick.

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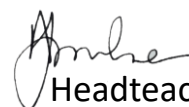
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Guitar, Ukulele and Brass Lessons
