



Headteacher's Report to the Governors

Introduction

Current NOR is 73 (3 over PAN). 10 children are leaving Year 6 (4 Grammar, 1 Independent, 2 Kingshill, 3 Balcarras), 1 child is joining sister at CKJS and 1 is moving to Rendcomb. 7 children will start in reception and 1 joiner in Year 2 (from Independent). We will be starting in September with NOR 69. Liz Black will be starting her maternity leave at the beginning of the Autumn term and will rejoin at the beginning of the Summer term 2020 – she will be replaced by Miss Katie Martin, an NQT. We have also had a second year BEd student in Class 3.

This summer term has seen two very successful residential trips (although we will not be returning to the Brecon Beacons); a Class 2 and 3 play (tonight); sports day organized by Mr Flounders; a Class 1 art trip and Class 3 trips to the Three Counties Show, Class 3 charity day (tomorrow); Rendcomb to see Jesus Christ Superstar and a geographical map walk; a summer fayre and a tray garden day.

This year we have raised approximately £8000 in school fund, £12,500 from LINKS, a churchyard wildlife grant (£250) and a Growing our Communities grant (£3000) and a lottery bid (£10,000). The "Little Extra" ring-fenced grant from the government was £5,119. Additional funds therefore total £38,869. The new trim trail and Class 1 playground has had a huge impact on the children regarding play opportunities.

We were delighted to be awarded the Healthy School Accreditation this year. Next year we would like to pursue the Mental Health Award, Eco School Accreditation and possibly Global Neighbours.

The new SIAMS schedule is published and we have completed our SEF, which has been discussed with teachers and a governors' panel committee. There is a new section on the school website with key documentation (u/n siams, p/w siams19). We are working with Kings Stanley C of E Primary School as they are due a SIAMS at the same time as us (Autumn 19).

- The new trim trail and Class 1's playground has had a positive impact on outdoor provision. The next phase is to repair the existing climbing frame, resource Class 1 play areas with storage and play equipment and purchase additional play equipment for the main playground.
- Liaison with Rendcomb College is proving fruitful. We are exploring the possibility of applying for a grant to use their science labs for our teaching of upper Key Stage 2.
- We are planning to incorporate the community into our weekly newsletter.
- Further plans include the S106 funding to expand the school and the new community centre.
